Wake County Smart Start to Host 2nd Annual Block Party & Resource Fair Celebrating Early Childhood

This year's event theme, *Parenthood*, honors the essential role of parents, grandparents, foster parents, and other caregivers in building a solid foundation for children's growth and development. The event will highlight the many ways caregiving comes to life in our community, the critical role families play in giving young children the best start in life, and the importance of community support in helping all families thrive.
